When you are a patient at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, your care is always a team effort. Each of our patient care teams combines the skills and experience of several healthcare professionals, many of whom specialize in diagnosing and treating one type of cancer—yours. Our team members meet regularly to discuss patients' diagnostic and treatment information, so that each patient benefits from a wide range of expertise. Representatives of many different disciplines involved in your care work to ensure that you receive the best possible treatment for your needs. Here is some information about their roles.

Treatment Team

For most cancers, treatment is led by one or more primary physicians, including a <u>medical oncologist</u>, <u>surgical oncologist</u>, and <u>radiation oncologist</u>. For some cancers, you may also see an <u>interventional radiologist</u>. Each of these experts brings a clear set of skills and techniques for treating cancer.



Diagnostic Team

The diagnostic team at Memorial Sloan Kettering includes a pathologist, radiologist, nuclear medicine specialist, and genetic cancer specialist. These doctors and related healthcare professionals use information from blood tests, imaging tests, and other specialized diagnostic tests to identify the type and location of cancer and determine the stage (extent) of the disease. Like the treatment team, members of the diagnostic team are trained to identify specific types of cancer—and both work together to develop an individualized treatment plan.
