Barrie R. Cassileth, PhD

Barrie R. Cassileth, PhD, is the incumbent of the Laurance S. Rockefeller Chair and Chief of Integrative Medicine Service at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center. She has studied, published, and lectured internationally on alternative and complementary (integrative) therapies for more than 25 years. She is the founding president of the International Society for Integrative Oncology and the editor-inchief of the *Journal of the Society for Integrative Oncology*. She has served on the national board of directors of the American Cancer Society and the advisory council to the National Institutes of Health Office of Alternative Medicine.

Yi Hung Chan, DPM, LAc

Yi Hung Chan, DPM, LAc, is the lead acupuncturist of the Integrative Medicine Service at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center. He brings with him a unique combination of allopathic medicine and traditional Chinese medicine training.
