Shabbat Visitors

Volunteers from Congregation Kehilath Jeshrun (KJ) Bikur Cholim Society visit patients on Shabbat upon request. They can offer prayer or kiddush at the bedside. Please call Spiritual Care at 212-639-5982 to request a visit.

Chai Lifeline offers visits to pediatric patients. To request a visit, call 848-480-3179.

Shabbat and Yom Tov Information

Electric Shabbat candles and grape juice can be requested before 3 pm. by calling Spiritual Care. **Due to fire laws, lighting actual candles is not permitted.**

The hospital entrance at 425 East 67th Street has mechanical doors. It is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Car 1 is the designated Shabbat elevator in the M (main building) elevator bank. Stairwell B near the M elevator bank offers access to all patient floors.

The sink in the Bikur Cholim room is manually operated.

Religious and Holiday Services

Mincha Minyan is held every Monday through Thursday at 4 pm in the chapel, which is located on the main floor opposite the information desk. Religious services and special holiday events are broadcast on Chapel Channel 109.1.

Holiday and Yom Tov services are held as noted in special bulletins that are distributed before each holiday. Call Spiritual Care Services at **212-639-5982** for more information.

Chesed 24/7 Hospitality Room

The hospitality room, located in room C172 between the B and C elevator banks, has light kosher meals, snacks, coffee, food warmers, and refrigeration for those of the Jewish faith who are visiting a loved one. Kosher food for patients is provided by the Food and Nutrition Department.

Glatt Kosher Food

Glatt kosher food, including challah and grape juice, is available to our patients. Contact our room service staff at 212-639-2200, between 7 am and 8 pm

Kosher certification is listed on our menus next to individual food items.

Kosher refrigerators are available on each nursing unit in the pantry.
