



About Durable Medical Equipment: Bed Canes

This information explains what a bed cane is, how to use it, and where you can buy it.

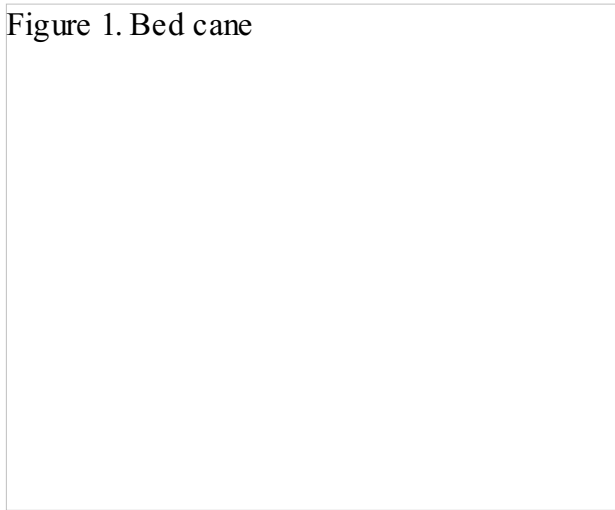


Figure 1. Bed cane

A bed cane is a device that can help you get in and out of bed easily (see Figure 1). Bed canes are helpful for people who may need extra support to stand up when getting out of bed or sit down when getting into bed.

How to Use a Bed Cane

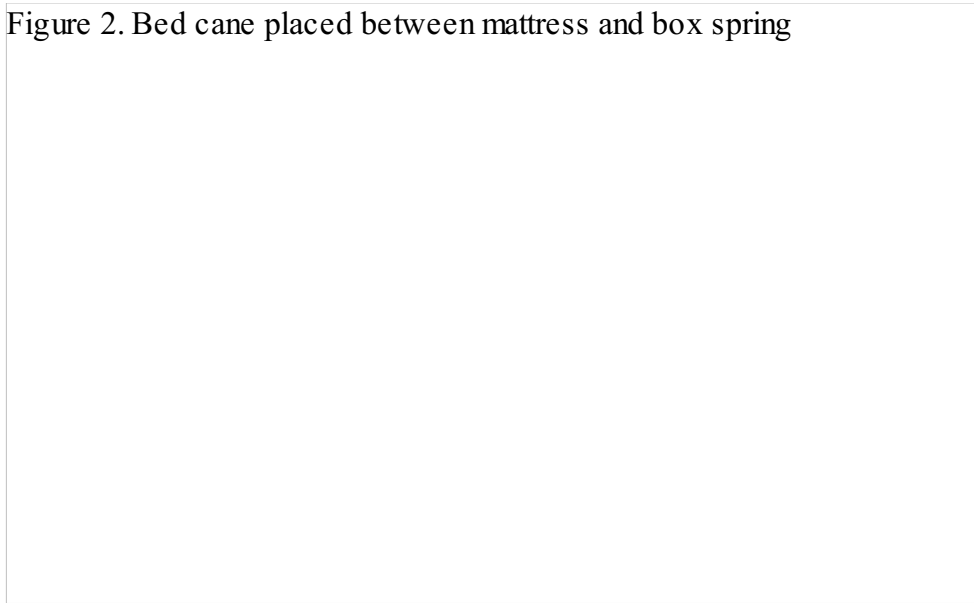


Figure 2. Bed cane placed between mattress and box spring

To use a bed cane, place the bed cane platform in between your mattress pad and the box spring (see Figure 2). You can place the bed cane on the right or left side of your bed. Once in place, you can use the handle to support your weight so you can safely stand up, sit down, or lie down in bed.

Where to Buy a Bed Cane

You can buy a bed cane at the following places:

- Medical supply stores
- Supercenters (such as Wal-Mart)
- Home improvement supply stores (such as Lowe's or Home Depot)
- Online retailers (such as Amazon)

Insurance plans don't usually cover bed canes. Check with your insurance provider to find out what your specific plan covers.

If your insurance provider covers bed canes, ask your healthcare provider for a prescription for one. Then you can submit the prescription to your insurance provider after you buy it.
