

What is lung cancer?

Lung cancer is one of the most common cancers in both men and women. It develops when abnormal cells grow in either the lungs or the bronchi (the air tubes that lead to the lungs).

Who is most at risk for lung cancer?

People who smoke usually are at greater risk for getting lung cancer. Research studies show that female smokers may be more likely to get the disease than male smokers. People who never smoked also can get lung cancer.

There is a growing trend among lung cancer cases. The disease is developing in people who never smoked, were only very light smokers, or who had no other risk factors. Almost 1 out of every 4 people treated for lung cancer at MSK are in this category, most of them female. Our doctors are experts in treating these lung cancer cases.

What are the main types of lung cancer?

Lung Cancer 2/4

There are 2 <u>main types of lung cancer</u>. They are called <u>non-small cell lung cancer</u> and <u>small cell lung cancer</u>. The difference is in the kind of cells the cancer started.

Non-small cell lung cancer is more common than small cell lung cancer. The treatment for non-small cell lung cancer is usually surgery. Small cell lung cancer often grows and spreads quickly. The standard treatment is chemotherapy.

A third, less common, type of lung cancer is called <u>lung carcinoid tumors</u>. These are sometimes called pulmonary carcinoid tumors or pulmonary neuroendocrine tumors.
