

Our team is advancing new approaches to finding and diagnosing and treating ovarian cancer.

To check for ovarian cancer, your doctor will likely perform a pelvic exam to feel for lumps or changes in and around the ovaries, and order additional tests if you've been experiencing persistent abdominal bloating, discomfort or other <u>symptoms</u>, or if you have <u>risk factors for ovarian cancer</u>.

Women found to have a suspicious mass or other indication of ovarian cancer should see an <u>ovarian cancer specialist</u>, ideally a gynecologic oncologist.

The following tests and procedures can help determine if you have ovarian, fallopian tube, or peritoneal cancer (the peritoneum is a layer of tissue that lines your abdomen). They can also help in determining the <u>stage of the cancer</u>, and build a <u>treatment</u> plan specifically for you.
