Three-year Accreditation Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME)-accredited fellowship

Combined training program: Fellows are appointed as members of both institutions (MSK and NYPH-WC)

Clinical rotations in the first year consist of a mix of inpatient services on oncology, hematology-oncology, and transplant and cellular therapy mixed with outpatient experience at MSK and NYPH-WC

The second and third years of fellowship are protected time for research, with ongoing responsibilities in the outpatient continuity clinic to maintain clinical skills
