The TY program consists of 26 weeks of internal medicine inpatient services, 4 weeks of surgery, 4 weeks of emergency medicine (rotation located at New York Presbyterian-Weill Cornell Hospital), 4 weeks of ambulatory medicine, 8 weeks of electives (with the option to complete up to 4 weeks of research), 2 weeks of selective rotations, and 4 weeks of vacation.

In addition to the clinical rotations, the TY program offers a robust educational curriculum that includes weekly Chief-Resident led morning report, twice weekly TY lectures, weekly Professor Rounds, and Department of Medicine Grand Rounds. We also have an Evidenced-Based Medicine curriculum, Quality Improvement curriculum as well as small group narrative medicine discussions.

The 8 weeks of elective rotations can be selected from the following:

## How to Apply

To apply, please participate in ERAS. Your application will be considered complete once you have submitted the following documents:

- Curriculum Vitae
- Personal Statement
- Medical School Transcript
- Three letters of recommendation (Including Research Mentor or Principal Investigator, if applicable)
- Dean's Letter

International Medical Graduates must also include a copy of their ECFMG Certificate. If you match with our program, we will consider sponsorship for a J-1 or H-1B visa. For the most up-to-date institutional policies, visit the [Graduate Medical Education page on visa options](#) .

Our selection committee evaluates applications based on academic performance during medical school, all letters of recommendation, research experience, leadership initiatives, extracurricular activities, USMLE scores, and academic potential.

## Program Requirements

To be considered for an interview, a passing score on the following exams is required for each applicant type:

- U.S. MD: Step 1 & Step 2 CK
- IMG: Step 1 & Step 2 CK
- U.S. DO: Level 1, Level 2 CE, Step 1, & Step 2 CK

No previous graduate medical education is required prior to entering this program. Applicants to this program should not have a gap between medical school graduation and their 1st residency greater than 2 years.
