



SAPNA PARIKH, MD, MPH

Dr. Parikh is an award-winning New York City–based multimedia journalist. She began her career as a television reporter in 2004 for CBS News and continued as a full-time correspondent for the FOX and ABC News stations in New York City.

Dr. Parikh's notable reports include an exclusive interview with NASA astronauts inside Aquarius, the only underwater laboratory in the world. She was the only television reporter invited to travel with First Lady Laura Bush to Haiti and Mexico City in 2008 to visit US-funded HIV clinics and launch an international breast cancer partnership. She is the recipient of two Humanitarian Awards for her reports on breast cancer and for serving as a role model to young women.

Dr. Parikh earned her medical degree from Northeast Ohio Medical University and completed her internship in general surgery at the Mount Sinai Medical Center in Manhattan. She obtained a master's of public health in community health education through Hunter College of the City University of New York and studied documentary and digital photography at the International Center of Photography and School of Visual Arts, also in New York City.
