

# GSK Teaching Fellows

Gerstner Sloan-Kettering Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences (GSK) has a teaching opportunity for MSK postdoctoral researchers in the GSK Core Course (GSKCC) which runs from September through May each year. All first year students (usually about ten) are required to take this course.

The class meets for three hours per day (9:00am to 12noon), Monday through Friday. Each session is divided into a lecture portion and a discussion portion in which a paper, assigned by the lecturer, is discussed.

The role of the GSK Teaching Fellow is to attend the classes, read the papers and facilitate discussion, lead one Special Topics class, lead one to two review sessions, and provide feedback to the students and Section Leaders about the students' participation and presentation.



GSK Teaching Fellows will be expected to commit to blocks of the course; each block is approximately two weeks.
