CYCLE FOR SURVIVAL

On Saturday, March 12th members of our Department participated in MSK's annual Cycle for Survival. Our team, "Epi-BioCyclers" was led by Team Captain, Cynthia Berry and the following team members; Jonine Bernstein, Helena Furberg-Barnes, Margaret Du, Elizabeth Kantor, Bradley Cohen, Shireen Lewis, Vincent Madonia, Zach Helms and Roxana Damian. At the event, each team member cycled for 50 minutes with the determination to help patients battling rare cancers. The team raised a total of \$8,745 towards their fundraising goal of \$10,000. Epi-BioCyclers are still accepting donations until April 1st.

Cycle for Survival is a national movement focused on beating rare cancers, in which 100% of every dollar raised goes directly to research at MSK. Cycle for Survival was founded by Jennifer Goodman Lin and her husband, Dave. Jennifer, a Memorial Sloan Kettering patient, was diagnosed with Sarcoma in 2004. The couple wanted to give back to her team at MSK so they organized a group of riders for an event that was known as, "Spin4Survivial" at a local Equinox. Each year, they were successful in raising more money and bringing in more participants. In 2009, Cycle for Survival became an official Memorial Sloan Kettering event, and Equinox was named a founding partner. Unfortunately, Jen lost her battle with cancer in 2011 but her legacy has continued. Cycle for Survival has raised \$100 million, to date, which has contributed to 100+ clinical trials and research studies at

NEW STAFF

Julien Mancini, MD, PhD, is a French public health practitioner affiliated with the "Cancers, Biomedicine & Society" research group (Aix-Marseille University, Institut Paoli-Calmettes) and the Clinical Epidemiology & Biostatistics unit at the Timone University Hospital (Marseille, APHM). His main research interests include cancer patients' information and involvement in decision-making, especially about participating in research. He also collaborates on



surveys measuring the long-term psychosocial impact of cancer, including intimacy issues. He will be a Visiting Investigator at MSK until the end of August to develop collaborative projects with Dr. Peter Bach and the Center for Health Policy and Outcomes. He is particularly interested in issues of rising costs in the context of precision oncology.

GRANTS

Helena Furberg-Barnes was awarded a two-year Chanel Survivorship grant to investigate body composition in relation to the obesity paradox in kidney cancer. The incidence of renal cell carcinoma (RCC) is increasing and so is obesity. High BMI is a risk factor for developing RCC but how it influences prognosis is unclear. Investigators found that RCC patients with high BMI actually survive longer than patients with normal BMI, a phenomenon known as the obesity paradox. With Chanel Survivorship funding they will refine body size measurement into specific body composition variables from CT scans and examine their association with BMI, cancer-specific mortality and genomic profiles to further our understanding of the obesity paradox. Helena is PI of the study and her collaborators include Emily Zabor (Biostatistics), Ari Hakimi (Surgery), Paul Russo (Surgery), Oguz Akin (Radiology), and Marina Mourtzakis (University of Waterloo).

Ethan Basch and Lauren Rogak co-authored two manuscripts with their co-investigators and the NCI PRO-CTCAE Study Group, including Mary Shaw and Narre Heon. The first, published in Health and Quality of Life Outcomes, reported their findings on the equivalence and acceptability of collecting PRO-CTCAE from participants using three different data collection modes: web, phone and paper. The second, published in the Journal of Supportive Care in Cancer, reported their work to translate and linguistically validate the PRO-CTCAE item library in Spanish. This validation included a complete forward and back translation of the item library as well as cognitive testing in native Spanish-speaking cancer patients at six participating institutions across the US. This study found that the items in the Spanish language version of the PRO-CTCAE are generally well understood, including those with low levels of education attainment and acculturation, and from diverse countries of origin.
